

Privacy Policy

C & J Geotechnical Services Ltd

We ask that you read this privacy notice carefully as it contains important information on who we are, how and why we collect, store, use and share personal information, your rights in relation to your personal information and on how to contact us and other organisations in the event you have a complaint. Please see the section on '**Your rights**' for more information.

Introduction

We are C & J Geotechnical Services Ltd. In order that we can provide our services to the people we support we collect and use certain personal information about you.

Personal information means any information about you from which you can be identified, but it does not include information where your identity has been removed (anonymous data).

As the 'controller' of personal information, we are responsible for how that data is managed. The General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR"), which applies in the United Kingdom and across the European Union, sets out our obligations to you and your rights in respect of how we manage your personal information.

As the 'controller' of your personal information, we will ensure that the personal information we hold about you is:

- Used lawfully, fairly and in a transparent way.
- Collected only for valid purposes that we have clearly explained to you and not used in any way that is incompatible with those purposes.
- Relevant to the purposes we have told you about and limited only to those purposes.
- Accurate and kept up to date.
- Kept only as long as necessary for the purposes we have told you about.
- Kept securely.

Information collected by us

When you enquire about our services and during the course of providing our services to you we collect the following personal information:

- your name, address, contact details (including your telephone number, Mobile number, email address)
- Financial details
- any information relevant to aid in us providing our service to you

Information collected from other sources

We may also obtain additional personal information from other sources such information publicly available on the internet, social media channels or any other third party.

Website & cookies

We also collect some data via our website and use cookies.

A cookie is an element of data that a website stores on its' device. Cookies allow us to understand who has seen the pages to determine how frequently particular pages are visited, and to determine the most popular areas of our website, it also stores information such as IP addresses, locations, browser used and other information to help our website to work smoothly. Refusing cookies may mean that you cannot access certain feature of our website.

Google Analytics may be used to collect standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour patterns. This is to establish details such as the number of visitors to various pages of our website. This information is only processed in a way which does not identify any individual. We do not make or allow Google to make any attempt to identify those individuals visiting our website.

None of the cookie information will identify you as an individual.

Any personal information you may submit via a contact form is collected via a secure connection and will be processed inline with our privacy policy terms.

How we use your personal information

We use your personal information to:

- communicate with you during the time we provide a service to you
- follow up contact and for after sales purposes
- create & provide a payment invoice or receipt
- provide ongoing support for as long as we provide a service to you
- help provide support and a faster service to you

Who we share your personal information with

We may need to share your personal information with our selected partners or suppliers.

We will share personal information with law enforcement or other authorities if required by law and with the appropriate court orders.

We will not share, sell or trade your personal information with any other third party.

How long your personal information will be kept

We will keep a secure record of your personal information for as long as we provide a service to you. In most cases after we no longer provide any services to you, we will retain your personal information for 6 years before it is destroyed.

How we store your personal information

We store all personal information on our servers and devices located in the UK, we may also use a third-party management service to process your data to provide you with a faster and more efficient service.

Where we use any third-party companies or services we will always where reasonably possible make adequate checks to ensure they are safe, secure and GDPR compliant even if outside the European union.

Your rights

Under the GDPR you have a number of important rights free of charge. In summary, those include rights to:

- fair processing of information and transparency over how we use your personal information;
- access to your personal information and to certain other supplementary information that this Privacy Notice is already designed to address;
- require us to correct any mistakes in your information which we hold;
- require the right to be forgotten (i.e. deletion) of personal information concerning you. (where legally possible)
- receive the personal information concerning you which you have provided to us, in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and have the right to transmit those data to a third party in certain situations;
- object at any time to processing of personal information concerning you for direct marketing;
- object to decisions being taken by automated means which produce legal effects concerning you or similarly significantly affect you;
- object in certain other situations to our continued processing of your personal information;

- otherwise restrict our processing of your personal information in certain circumstances;
- claim compensation for damages caused by our breach of any data protection laws;

We also have procedures in place to deal with any suspected data security breach. We will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected data security breach where we are legally required to do so.
